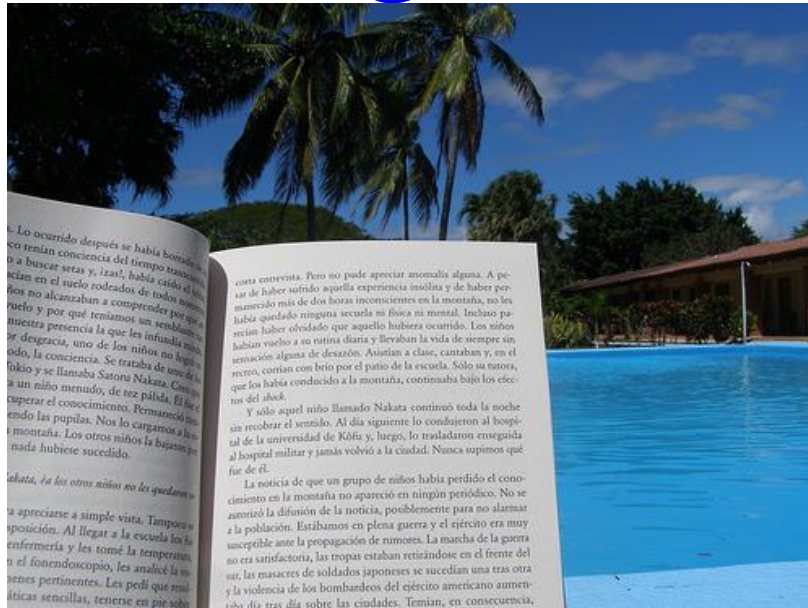

Overview

The main goal of Centreville Middle School's Summer Reading Program is to encourage reading through the summer so students return in the fall prepared for a new school year. We also have a creative component for students to take their reading a step further.

Note: Students may choose Option 1 OR Option 2 OR do both options.

Option 1: Reading for Enjoyment

Attached you will find a **SUMMER READING LOG**. You can read any number of books, but to be in the drawing to win *prizes and to be invited to the Ice Cream Social** you must read at least three. When you finish each book, write the title on the reading log and have a parent or guardian to sign off on it.

**Prizes:*

1. Entered into drawing for **GIFT CARDS**
2. Invited to the **CMS Ice Cream Social in the Fall**.

Option 2: Creative Projects

Also included is a list of projects for if you wish to show us your creative side. Once you choose a project, we encourage you to have fun creating something for other students to see. To be invited to the Ice Cream Social, you must read one book and create a project. When you return to school, you will be invited to the CMS Ice Cream Social where all projects will be shared and winners will be chosen by their peers. First, second, and third place winners will receive great **GIFT CARDS**.

Option 1: Reading Log

Note: Students may choose Option 1 OR Option 2 OR do both options.

Sell It!

Your job is to promote your novel so that others will be persuaded to read it. To do this you will create a persuasive and eye-catching poster or technology-based product* that would appear in the bookstore or on a website. It must include persuasive phrases, quotes, and pictures/graphics.

I've Been Framed

Create "framed" portraits of the main characters from your novel (Use can use real frames or be creative in making your own). In the background of each portrait, include important setting elements/props that relate to the character. Make sure we know the name of your character.

Create a Comic

Turn an important **scene** or **chapter** into a comic book/graphic novel, complete with comic-style illustrations. Must include a minimum of eight frames using dialogue bubbles, thinking bubbles, color, and narrative. Present on a poster board or in a technological format*

Script It

Imagine YOU are the author of the book you have just read. Suddenly, your book becomes a best seller and Paramount pictures wants to make it into a movie. They ask you to create a movie theatre poster or movie trailer* to promote your movie. Refer to actual movie trailers and posters as a guide. *Consider using Movie Maker, We Video, or Screencastify for the trailer)

Picture Says a Thousand Words

Recreate the old cover and then create a new one for your book by hand-drawing a poster or using technology*. Then, explain your reasoning for the new design.

Theme Song

Choose a popular song with appropriate lyrics that you think best represents your book. You will play this for students at the ice cream social. Create an eye-catching poster board or technological product that explains how the song relates to the novel.

Make sure to bring a copy of your book to display with your project.
